- C. To promote the collaboration and engagement of families and educators in the education of children and youth.
- D. To engage the public in united efforts to secure the physical, mental, emotional, spiritual, and social well-being of all children and youth.
- E. To advocate for fiscal responsibility regarding public tax dollars in public education funding.

Proposed Amendment

ARTICLE II PURPOSES

Section 1. Objectives, The purposes of the PTA are To promote the welfare of children and youth in home, school, community, and place of worship,

- A. To promote the welfare of children and youth in home, school, places of worship, and throughout the community;
- B. To raise the standards of home life;
- C. To advocate for laws that further the education, physical and mental health, welfare, and safety of 15 children and youth;
- D. To promote the collaboration and engagement of families and educators in the education of 17 children and youth;
- E. To engage the public in united efforts to secure the physical, mental, emotional, spiritual, and 19 social well-being of all children and youth; and
- F. To advocate for fiscal responsibility regarding public tax dollars in public education funding

Rationale: Updating the language to align with National PTA bylaw wording.

Replace Section 2. Qualifications. "The National Board of Directors (National PTA) and the Arizona PTA Board of Directors/Managers shall determine criteria for establishing constituent associations and setting standards for continuing affiliation with National PTA and Arizona PTA" with "The Arizona PTA shall determine criteria for establishing constituent associations and setting standards for continuing affiliation with the Arizona PTA and National PTA."

Such books of account and records, including those of constituent associations, shall at all reasonable times be open to inspection by an authorized representative of the National PTA.

ARTICLE V ARIZONA PTA

Section 10. The Arizona PTA shall keep such permanent books of account and records as shall be sufficient to establish the items of gross income, receipts, and disbursements of the association. This includes the number of local PTAs/PTSAs units within its area, the National PTA portion of membership dues collected by such local PTAs/PTSAs units, the amounts of such dues received by the Arizona PTA, and the amounts of dues remitted to the National PTA. Such books of account and records, including those of constituent associations, shall at all reasonable times be open to inspection by an authorized representative of the National PTA.

Rationale: These duties are part of the Standards of Affiliation required of Arizona PTA by National PTA, therefore this section is redundant.

ARTICLE VI LOCAL PTA/PTSA UNITS

Section 1. Local PTA/PTSA units shall be organized and chartered under the authority of the Arizona PTA in the area in which the local PTA/PTSA unit functions, in conformity with such rules and regulations, not in conflict with the National PTA bylaws, as the Arizona PTA may in its bylaws prescribe. The Arizona PTA shall issue to each local PTA/PTSA unit a charter evidencing the due association and good standing of such local PTA/PTSA unit.

A local PTA/PTSA unit shall be in good standing if it adheres to the Arizona PTA Standards of Affiliation and:

- A. Adheres to the Purposes and Principles of the National PTA and Arizona PTA; and
- B. Remits the National PTA portion of the dues through the Arizona PTA to reach the national office by dates designated by the National PTA.
- C. Has bylaws approved by Arizona PTA according to the procedures of the Unified Local PTA/PTSA Unit Bylaws.
- D. Remits the state and national portions of each member's dues.
- E. Meets all other criteria as prescribed by the Arizona PTA.

Section 2. Each local PTA/PTSA unit shall keep such permanent books of accounts and records as shall be sufficient to establish the items of gross income, receipts, and disbursements of the association, including, specifically, the number of its members, the dues collected from its members, and the amount of dues remitted to the Arizona PTA. Records shall at all reasonable times be open to inspection by an authorized representative of the Arizona PTA or by a duly authorized representative of the National PTA.

Section 3. The charter of a local PTA/PTSA unit may be subject to dissolution and/or revocation and therefore the status of such association as a local PTA/PTSA unit shall be subject to termination, in the manner and under the circumstances provided by the Arizona PTA.

- D. Approval of dissolution of the local PTA/PTSA unit shall require the affirmative vote of at least two-thirds (2/3rds) of the local PTA/PTSA unit members present and entitled to vote at the special meeting, a quorum being present.

Section 12. Reinstatement. In all cases of reinstatement of local PTA/PTSA units, submission of a formal application in writing to the state office shall be required. Such reinstatement shall be done upon recommendation of the local PTA/PTSA unit's Region Director or other member of the Arizona PTA Board of Managers.

The National PTA portion of each member's dues shall be two dollars and twenty-five cents (\$2.25) per annum. The total amount remitted to the Arizona PTA shall be five dollars and fifty cents (\$5.50) for each member. Annual dues for members shall include an amount for the Local PTA as determined by the Local PTA, state dues in the amount of \$3.25, and National dues as determined by National PTA

Rationale: This amendment allows for National PTA dues amount changes to occur without Arizona PTA needing to change our bylaws.

The Arizona PTA and National PTA portions of the dues are paid each membership year by each member to a local PTA/PTSA unit and remitted by that local PTA/PTSA unit physically or electronically to the Arizona PTA located at 2721 North Seventh Avenue, Phoenix, Arizona 85007-1102, on a monthly basis.

Proposed Amendment

ARTICLE VII MEMBERS AND DUES

Section 7. The Arizona PTA shall make remittances, on a monthly basis, to the National PTA of the amounts due to the National PTA.

Section 8. The Arizona PTA and National PTA portions of the dues are paid each membership year by each member to a local PTA/PTSA unit and remitted by that local PTA/PTSA unit physically or electronically to the Arizona PTA located at 2721 North Seventh Avenue, Phoenix, Arizona 85007-1102, on a monthly basis.

Rationale: This information is outlined in National PTA's Standards of Affiliation and does not need to be in our State bylaws.

ARTICLE VIII ARIZONA PTA OFFICERS AND THEIR ELECTION

Section 2.A. To be eligible for nomination to the office of President, or President-Elect (or 1st Vice President when applicable), a person must have experience serving as an officer for at least one (1) year on a local PTA/PTSA unit or PTA/PTSA council and at least two (2) years of Arizona PTA Board of Managers experience including Executive Committee experience. Nominees must be a member of a local PTA/PTSA unit before election.

ARTICLE VIII ARIZONA PTA OFFICERS AND THEIR ELECTION

Section 2.A. To be eligible for nomination to the office of President, or President-Elect (or 1st Vice President when applicable), a person must have experience serving as an officer for at least **two (2)** one (1) years on a local PTA/PTSA unit or PTA/PTSA council and at least two (2) years of Arizona PTA Board of Managers experience including Executive Committee experience. Nominees must be a member of a local PTA/PTSA unit before election.

Rationale: This amendment aligns the experience needed for the offices of President and President-Elect with the Vice-President position. The office of President or President-Elect should not need less experience than that of the Vice President.

ARTICLE VIII ARIZONA PTA OFFICERS AND THEIR ELECTION

Section 4.E. Vacancies In the absence of a Region Director the Vice President or Board of Managers shall assign the Field Service Chair or a member of the Field Service Committee or a designated Arizona PTA representative to assist the Board of Managers and/or local PTA/PTSA units of that region.

Rationale: This amendment allows the Vice President to assign someone to assist regions that do not have a Region Director. This will allow support for regions more easily.

- A. **Regular**. The NCAAC shall meet a minimum of twice per year.
- B. **Special.** Special meetings may be called by the chair with approval by the National PTA President.

ARTICLE XXIII: NATIONAL CONSTITUENT ASSOCIATION ADVISORY COUNCIL

Section 3. Chair, Vice-Chair, and Secretary

The National PTA president-elect shall serve as the chair. The vice chair, and secretary shall be elected from amongst the current state constituent association presidents via an electronic meeting within 45 days following the close of each National PTA Annual Meeting. The term of office for the chair, vice chair, and secretary shall begin upon conclusion of the NCAAC meeting at which they are elected and end at the conclusion of NCAAC meeting following the next National PTA Annual Meeting.

Section 4. Duties. The NCAAC shall:

- A.—identify and prioritize topics and trends to assist the board in setting the strategic direction of National PTA.
- B.—submit written reports and make recommendations to the board regarding emerging issues, as referenced in PTA policy.
- C. participate in leadership development meetings at least twice per year, one of which is during the National PTA Annual Convention
 - and another meeting sometime during the calendar year either in person or electronically.

Section 4. Meetings.

- A. Regular. The NCAAC shall meet a minimum of twice per year.
- B. Special. Special meetings may be called by the chair with approval by the National PTA a.—President.

Rationale: This amendment removes wording that is defined in National PTA bylaws and does not pertain to Arizona PTA.
