



Keynote Speaker





In accordance with the Arizona PTA Bylaws each local unit shall be entitled to be represented at the annual convention of the Arizona PTA by four (4) of its officers or their alternates, and by one additional delegate per fifty members or major fraction thereof as shown on the books of the state treasurer on March first (1st). If you are sending an officer other than one of the four main officers or a delegate who is not an officer, please make sure to send your meeting minutes approving the alternates and/or additional delegates for voting delegate status.

Every delegate must register and pay for convention in order to vote during General Session. Only those on who were paid members of a local unit in Good Standing by March 1 will be considered voting delegates. If you are unsure of your delegate status please email membership@azpta.org.






Awards

Local Unit of the Year

This award will be given to the Local PTA/PTSA Unit of the Year. This award recognizes a local unit that has demonstrated a commitment to the mission and purposes of PTA. This award focuses on membership, activities and programs for the entire year.

Outstanding Unit for Family Engagement Award

This award will be given to a local PTA/PTSA unit that demonstrates a commitment to the Six National Standards for Family-School Partnerships as well as the overall mission and purpose of PTA.

Local Unit Volunteer of the Year

Arizona PTA's Volunteer of the Year Award recognizes and honors outstanding a volunteer who has given selflessly to make their school community a better place for students and staff to achieve their goals.

This special person does not need to be the person who logs the most volunteer hours or a PTA/PTSA executive board member. Nominees should be someone who has made a positive impact on the school and its children. Favorable consideration is given to the nominee who also is shown to have promoted membership in the PTA/PTSA. All PTA/PTSA local units are encouraged to participate in this recognition of volunteers.

Cornerstone Award

Arizona PTA's Cornerstone Award recognizes and honors a non-certified staff member currently working with, for or on behalf of children. Support staff are the cornerstone of the school community. Please check with your school to identify who is considered non-certified staff. This nominee should exemplify the mission and purposes of PTA.

SuperMAN Award

Arizona PTA's SuperMAN Award recognizes and honors an outstanding male leader in the community. The nominee must be a member of the PTA/PTSA.

This special person does not need to be the person who logs the most volunteer hours or a PTA/PTSA Executive Board member. Nominees should be someone who has made a positive impact on the school and its children. Favorable consideration is given to the nominee who also is shown to have promoted membership in the PTA/PTSA. All local units are encouraged to participate in this recognition of volunteers.

Future Leader Award

This award recognizes an outstanding student leader in the PTA/PTSA community. This nominee must be a member of the PTA/PTSA and be capable of understanding, participating in discussion and debating motions without adult assistance to be considered for this award.

Power Partner Award (Educational Professional, Non-teaching)

Arizona PTA's Power Partner Award recognizes and honors an education professional in a non-teaching role currently working with or on behalf of students. This person must be a member of the PTA/PTSA and exemplify the mission and purposes of PTA. This person could be a Principal, Vice Principal, Superintendent, Counselor, Governing Board member or other professional in the education community.

Champion for Children Award

Arizona PTA's Champion for Children Award recognizes and honors a PTA/PTSA member for exceptional efforts to advocate, support and speak on behalf of all children and youth in their community.

Election Procedures- Nominations From The Floor

PROCEDURE FOR NOMINATIONS FROM THE FLOOR

(ARIZONA PTA BYLAWS ARIZONA OFFICERS AND THEIR ELECTION Article VIII, Section 1.E) Any member planning to run from the floor for a position must advise the Arizona PTA President twenty- one (21) calendar days before the First General Session of the annual Arizona PTA convention.

The slate of officers for the 2022-2023 term is as follows:

Vice President of Membership

Region Director Positions

Southwest Maricopa Region Director

Northeast Maricopa Region Director

Western Region Director

If a member is interested in a position listed, they can be nominated from the floor at the First General Session during convention, June 24, 2022. **A member must advise the Arizona PTA President no later than June 3, 2022, emailing the appropriate forms to the Arizona PTA President at agabriellini@azpta.org** . A member must meet the qualifying criteria which shall be verified by the Nominating Committee. The following provisions shall govern the qualifications and eligibility of candidates for election.

Qualifications:

To be eligible for nomination for the office of Vice-President of Membership a person must have experience serving as an officer of a local PTA/PTSA unit or PTA/PTSA council totaling at least two (2) years and have a background in membership, and data management skills. Nominees must be a member of a local PTA/PTSA unit before election. (ARIZONA PTA BYLAWS ARTICLE VIII, ARIZONA PTA OFFICERS AND THEIR ELECTIONS Section 2.C.)

The Secretary, the Region Directors and the Treasurer are exempt from the requirement of the Arizona PTA Board of Managers experience. However, to be eligible for nomination as a Secretary, or Region Director, a person must have a background of at least two (2) years accumulated PTA/PTSA experience. To be eligible for nomination as Treasurer, a person must have a background in bookkeeping or finance. Nominees must be a member of a local PTA/PTSA unit before election. (ARIZONA PTA BYLAWS ARTICLE VIII, ARIZONA PTA OFFICERS AND THEIR ELECTIONS Section 2.D.)

Each officer shall be a member of a local PTA/PTSA unit within the area of the Arizona PTA. (ARIZONA PTA BYLAWS ARTICLE VIII, ARIZONA PTA OFFICERS AND THEIR ELECTIONS Section 1.C.)

What is the Reflections Program??

National PTA's Reflections program provides opportunities for recognition and access to the arts which boost student confidence and success in the arts and in life.

Each year, over 300,000 students in Pre-K through Grade 12 create original works of art in response to a student-selected theme. This 50+ year-old program helps them explore their own thoughts, feelings and ideas, develop artistic literacy, increase confidence and find a love for learning that will help them become more successful in school and in life.

The 2022-2023 Reflections theme is **Show Your Voice!**

Students submit their completed works of art in one or all of the available arts categories: Dance Choreography, Film Production, Literature, Music Composition, Photography, Visual Arts.

Arizona PTA will communicate deadlines and resources via social media and newsletters.

Where do I start??

1. Get familiar with theme and the categories and recruit a team and a set of judges (August)
2. Promote your program, partner with teachers to see if they can make it part of their curriculum and build the buzz (mid August to early September)
3. Officially kick off the program, highly recommended you start during National Arts in Education Week (Sept. 11 –17, 2022)
4. Host an event during National Arts and Humanities Month (October) offer time, space and materials for students to participate in the arts.
5. Start collecting the submissions and do the judging (Mid October-Early November)

(M) = Membership




