
## **2024 CONVENTION RULES**

Arizona PTA is a professional, nonprofit association committed to providing valuable and safe conference and exhibition experiences. Arizona PTA is dedicated to equal opportunity and treatment for all its members, meeting attendees, staff, and service providers.

## **GENERAL RULES**

- 1. All registered accredited delegates, registered alternates, any other PTA member registrants, National PTA representatives, invited speakers, guests, past Arizona PTA Presidents, must display the official convention badge to enter all General Meetings, presentations, meal functions, workshops, and to enter the exhibit hall.
- 2. Accredited registered voting delegates must be seated in the designated voting delegate sections before the opening of each General Meeting. Accredited registered voting delegates, registered attendees and any other PTA member registrants must show their convention badge for entrance to all General Meetings and when re-entering the General Meetings. Registered alternates and any other PTA member registrants must be seated in designated non-voting sections during all General Meetings.
- 3. National PTA representatives, invited speakers and guests shall be accompanied by the President or a designated board of managers representative for entrance into the General Meetings, being seated in a reserved area. The aforementioned representatives and guests shall have the privilege of speaking but not the privilege of making motions, debating, or voting.
- 4. All messages and announcements must be given to a page or designated person. No message may be presented directly to the Chair. Only announcements pertaining to the Convention program and emergencies shall be made from the platform.
- 5. The Parliamentarian shall advise the presiding officer on points of procedure and upon request of the presiding officer, shall explain such points to the delegates.
- 6. There will be an official Timekeeper at all General Meetings.
- 7. All registered accredited voting delegates, registered alternates, any other PTA member registrants, Arizona PTA board members, volunteers, vendors/exhibitors, service providers are expected to be respectful of others. Harassment and other misconduct will not be tolerated. Arizona PTA, at its sole discretion, reserves the right to accept or decline an individual's registration for the convention and General Meetings event.
- 8. Arizona PTA reserves the right to prohibit entry or remove any individual whether registered or not, whether they are registered accredited voting delegates, registered alternates, or any other PTA member registrants, exhibitors, representatives, vendors who in Arizona PTA's sole opinion are not keeping with the character and purpose of the convention and General Meetings.
- 9. Without limiting the aforementioned, Arizona PTA reserves the right to confiscate convention delegate badges, alternate badges, any other PTA member registrants badges, remove or refuse entry to any accredited voting delegate, alternate, any other PTA member registrant, exhibitor, representatives/vendors who have registered or gained access under false pretenses, provided false information, or for any other reason whatsoever that they deem is caused under the circumstances. In such a case, if any registration/exhibitor or vendor space fees have been paid, no refunds will be given.

# 2024-ELECTION PROCEDURES NOMINATIONS FROM THE FLOOR



If a member is interested in a position listed but didn't complete the slated candidate process or was not slated, they can run from the floor at the First General Session during the Convention on June 21, 2024.

Prior to the General Session floor nomination, candidates must advise the Arizona PTA President of their intention to run from the floor by 11:59 p.m. on May 31, 2024, and include the completed candidate forms to the Arizona PTA President (president@azpta.org), for review and processing.


## **RUN FROM THE FLOOR APPLICATION**

Candidate applications are reviewed by the Nominating Committee to ensure qualifications are met. Candidates must be a member of a local PTA/PTSA unit before the election.

Candidates must meet the qualifying criteria to be eligible to run from the floor. The following provisions shall govern the qualifications and eligibility of candidates for election.



# 2024-ELECTION PROCEDURES QUALIFICATIONS



Qualifications: To be eligible for nomination for the office of Vice-President of Membership a person must have experience serving as an officer of a local PTA/PTSA unit or PTA/PTSA council totaling at least two (2) years and have a background in membership, and data management skills.

## ARIZONA PTA BYLAWS ARTICLE VIII, ARIZONA PTA OFFICERS AND THEIR ELECTIONS Section 2.C.

The Secretary, the Region Directors and the Treasurer are exempt from the requirement of the Arizona PTA Board of Managers experience.

To be eligible for nomination as a Secretary, or Region Director, a person must have a background of at least two (2) years accumulated PTA/PTSA experience.

To be eligible for nomination as Treasurer: a person must have a background in bookkeeping or finance.

# 2024-ELECTION COMMMITTEE RULES NOMINATIONS FROM THE FLOOR

Election committee rules from Arizona PTA Standing Rules:

**ELECTION COMMITTEE** 

Arizona PTA bylaws ARTICLE XII- SECTION 8

The Board of Managers shall elect the members of the Election Committee during the winter meeting. This committee shall serve from the date of their election until the Arizona PTA convention adjourns. No candidate for any office at the Arizona PTA convention may serve on this committee. The chair shall be appointed by the President. The current Arizona PTA President may not sit on this committee.

- 1. The Election Committee Chair shall obtain a list of candidates from the Nominating Committee Chair.
- 2. The Election Committee Chair shall send letters to all official candidates regarding campaign material rules as soon after March 1st as possible.
- 3. The Election Committee Chair will provide copies of the rules to the Nominating Committee Chair to be given to candidates nominated from Arizona PTA convention floor.
- 4. The Election Committee Chair will discuss with the Convention Chair where candidates' literature tables are to be located, and the number of tables required.
- 5. The Election Committee Chair will assign tables.
- 6. The Election Committee Chair will inform nominees of their assigned tables, in writing prior to arrival at the Arizona PTA convention if possible, or upon arrival at the convention site by drawing names 24 hours in advance of first general session.
- 7. The Election Committee Chair shall draw up the ballot and have sufficient ballots available for the registered voting delegates. In the case of there being only one candidate for an office, a voice vote may be taken. Region Directors will be elected by ballot only.
- 8.All ballots will have nominees for officers, such as President, President-Elect, and Vice President. Use different color paper to designate different ballots when region directors are being elected. If a voting delegate is from a region that is not electing a Region Director, they will simply get a white ballot that lists general nominees. Not voting for a palticular office does not negate the ballot.
- 9. Post a sign behind the voting table with ballot color designations.
- 10. The Election Committee Chair will obtain the ballot box, necessary supplies (such as paper ballots) and prepare them for use.
- 11. The Election Committee will establish the secure location of the ballot box and at least two (2) members of the committee will be present at the polling place at all times. Ballots will be safeguarded. A ballot will be handed to a registered, accredited voting delegate after the delegate has signed in on the roster of accredited delegates at the poll.
- 12. Voting delegates shall be allowed at least two (2) hours on the second day of the convention to cast their vote for the election of officers. All registered/accredited voting delegates will be required to sign in. When a registered, accredited voting delegate has voted, a committee member shall hole-punch through their nametag.
- 13. The Election Committee shall count the ballots following the final closing of the polls. In the event of a tie, an announcement will be made at the next General Session and the run-off election will take place during a recess to that General Session. Ballot tallies shall be announced for each office at this general session. The Election Chair will submit a written report of the voting results during the convention to the chair (presiding officer) RRONR.
- 14. Ballots will be kept at the AZ PTA office for sixty (60) days and then destroyed.
- 15.It is the responsibility of the Election Committee to settle any grievance brought to their attention that deals with any reported infraction of election and/or campaigning rules.
- 16.The Election Committee Chair shall plan in advance to have the National PTA Representative observer, if available, oversee counting of ballots in a prearranged location. The National PTA Representative (if available), Election Committee Chair, and committee members' signatures must appear on the Election report.



The Bylaws Committee has met with National PTA representatives, Arizona PTA members for feedback and insight. The Bylaws committee has worked hard to bring forward the proposed amendments to the Arizona PTA Bylaws.

Please review the proposed amendments prior to June 21, 2024 General Session 1 where Bylaws will be formally presented for review.

If you have a question or need help with writing an amendment, you can speak to a member of the Bylaws Committee prior to General Session 1 and additional questions can be asked during General Session 1, as well. It is important to review these documents that govern your local PTA/PTSA unit.

Arizona PTA 2024 Annual Meeting of the Membership: Proposed Amendments

#### **Proposed Amendment 1**

Strike "a non-profit corporation under the laws of Arizona. It is commonly known/dba and will be referred to in these bylaws as the Arizona PTA."

#### **Current Language**

## ARTICLE I

The name of this association is Arizona Congress of Parents and Teachers, Inc., a non-profit corporation organized under the laws of Arizona. It is commonly known/dba and will be referred to in these bylaws as the Arizona PTA. hereafter known as Arizona PTA, a branch of the National Congress of Parents and Teachers, the National PTA. The Arizona PTA shall be governed by the Arizona Corporation Commission.

#### **Proposed Amendment**

#### ARTICLE I Name

The name of this association is Arizona Congress of Parents and Teachers, Inc., a non-profit corporation organized under the laws of Arizona. It is commonly known/dba and will be referred to in these bylaws as the Arizona PTA. hereafter known as Arizona PTA, a branch of the National Congress of Parents and Teachers, the National PTA. The Arizona PTA shall be governed by the Arizona Corporation Commission.

Rationale: Updating the language to align with National PTA bylaw wording.

### **Proposed Amendment 2**

Replace section 1. Objectives with

"The purposes of the PTA are

- A. A. To promote the welfare of children and youth in home, school, community, and place of worship.
- B. To raise the standards of home life,
- C. To secure adequate laws for the care and protection of children and youth,
- D. To bring into closer relation the home and the school, parents, and teachers may cooperate intelligently in the education of children and youth, and
- E. To develop between educators and the general public, such united efforts as will secure for all children and youth the highest advantages in physical, mental, social, and spiritual education.
- F. To advocate for fiscal responsibility regarding public tax dollars in public education funding"

### **Current Language**

## ARTICLE II PURPOSES

**Section 1. Objectives,** The purposes of the Arizona PTA held in common with those of the National PTA, are:

- A. To raise the standards of home life.
- B. To advocate for laws that further the education, physical and mental health, welfare, and safety of children and youth.
- C. To promote the collaboration and engagement of families and educators in the education of children and youth.
- To engage the public in united efforts to secure the physical, mental, emotional, spiritual, and social well-being of all children and youth.
- To advocate for fiscal responsibility regarding public tax dollars in public education funding.

### Proposed Amendment

## ARTICLE II PURPOSES

Section 1. Objectives, The purposes of the PTA are To promote the welfare of children and youth in home, school, community, and place of worship,

- A. To promote the welfare of children and youth in home, school, places of worship, and throughout the community;
- B. To raise the standards of home life;
- C. To advocate for laws that further the education, physical and mental health, welfare, and safety of 15 children and youth:
- To promote the collaboration and engagement of families and educators in the education of 17 children and youth;
- E. To engage the public in united efforts to secure the physical, mental, emotional, spiritual, and 19 social well-being of all children and youth; and
- F. To advocate for fiscal responsibility regarding public tax dollars in public education funding

**Section 1.** Local PTA/PTSA units shall be organized and chartered under the authority of the Arizona PTA in the area in which the local PTA/PTSA unit functions, in conformity with such rules and regulations, not in conflict with the National PTA bylaws, as the Arizona PTA may in its bylaws prescribe. The Arizona PTA shall issue to each local PTA/PTSA unit a charter evidencing the due association and good standing of such local PTA/PTSA unit.

A local PTA/PTSA unit shall be in good standing if it adheres to the Arizona PTA Standards of Affiliation and:

- A. Adheres to the Purposes and Principles of the National PTA and Arizona PTA; and
- B. Remits the National PTA portion of the dues through the Arizona PTA to reach the national office by dates designated by the National PTA.
- C. Has bylaws approved by Arizona PTA according to the procedures of the Unified Local PTA/PTSA Unit Bylaws.
- D. Remits the state and national portions of each member's dues.
- E. Meets all other criteria as prescribed by the Arizona PTA.

**Section 2.** Each local PTA/PTSA unit shall keep such permanent books of accounts and records as shall be sufficient to establish the items of gross income, receipts, and disbursements of the association, including, specifically, the number of its members, the dues collected from its members, and the amount of dues remitted to the Arizona PTA. Records shall at all reasonable times be open to inspection by an authorized representative of the Arizona PTA or by a duly authorized representative of the National PTA.

**Section 3.** The charter of a local PTA/PTSA unit may be subject to dissolution and/or revocation and therefore the status of such association as a local PTA/PTSA unit shall be subject to termination, in the manner and under the circumstances provided by the Arizona PTA.

**Section 4.** Each local PTA/PTSA unit is obligated, upon dissolution and/or revocation of its charter, by

**Section 5.** Each officer or board member of a local PTA/PTSA unit shall be a member of such local PTA/PTSA unit.

**Section 6.** Only members of local PTA/PTSA units who have paid dues for the current membership year may participate in the business of the local PTA/PTSA unit.

**Section 7.** Each local PTA/PTSA unit shall collect dues from its individual members and shall remit the National PTA and the Arizona PTA portion of such dues to the Arizona PTA as provided in Article VII hereof

**Section 8.** Each local PTA/PTSA unit shall include in its bylaws provisions corresponding to the provisions of the Arizona PTA Bylaws.

**Section 9.** Each local PTA/PTSA unit shall secure a minimum of 10 (ten) members annually, as required per the Unified Local PTA/PTSA Unit Bylaws establishment of all charters. This shall include the local PTA/PTSA unit officers.

Section 10. Removal from Office. For the good of the local PTA/PTSA unit any elected officer or board member who has failed to perform his/her duties may be removed without cause from office. Removal from office shall be by ½ majority vote of the members present and voting at a meeting provided written notice of the meeting included the intent to remove an officer has been given according to your Arizona PTA Unified Local PTA/PTSA Unit Bylaws.

**Section 11. Dissolution**. A local PTA/PTSA unit shall dissolve its association with the Arizona PTA (and the National PTA) and finalize its affairs in the following manner:

A. The Executive Committee (or other body that, under its bylaws manages the affairs of the local PTA/PTSA unit) shall make a recommendation during a meeting of that body that the local PTA/PTSA unit be

The Arizona PTA or any of its local PTA/PTSA units and PTA/PTSA councils may cooperate with other organizations and agencies concerned with child welfare, but a PTA/PTSA representative shall make no commitments on behalf of the group they represent.

**Rationale:** This amendment clarifies that partnerships with other organizations. Removing the local PTA/PTSA wording allows local PTAs to vote on which organizations they wish to partner with.

## ARTICLE XXIII: NATIONAL CONSTITUENT ASSOCIATION ADVISORY COUNCIL

#### Section 3. Chair, Vice-Chair, and Secretary

The National PTA president-elect shall serve as the chair. The vice chair, and secretary shall be elected from amongst the current state constituent association presidents via an electronic meeting within 45 days following the close of each National PTA Annual Meeting. The term of office for the chair, vice chair, and secretary shall begin upon conclusion of the NCAAC meeting at which they are elected and end at the conclusion of NCAAC meeting following the next National PTA Annual Meeting.

## Section 4. Duties. The NCAAC shall:

- A. identify and prioritize topics and trends to assist the board in setting the strategic direction of National PTA.
- submit written reports and make recommendations to the board regarding emerging issues, as referenced in PTA policy.
- C. participate in leadership development meetings at least twice per year, one of which

during the National PTA Annual Convention and another meeting sometime during the calendar year either in person or electronically.

#### Section 4. Meetings.

- A. **Regular**. The NCAAC shall meet a minimum of twice per year.
- B. Special. Special meetings may be called by the chair with approval by the National PTA President.

## ARTICLE XXIII: NATIONAL CONSTITUENT ASSOCIATION ADVISORY COUNCIL

#### Section 3. Chair, Vice Chair, and Secretary

The National PTA president elect shall serve as the chair. The vice chair, and secretary shall be elected from amongst the current state constituent association presidents via an electronic meeting within 45 days following the close of each National PTA Annual Meeting. The term of office for the chair, vice chair, and secretary shall begin upon conclusion of the NCAAC meeting at which they are elected and end at the conclusion of NCAAC meeting following the next National PTA Annual Meeting.

## Section 4. Duties. The NCAAC shall:

- A. identify and prioritize topics and trends to assist the board in setting the strategic direction of National PTA.
- B. submit written reports and make recommendations to the board regarding emerging issues, as referenced in PTA policy.
- C. participate in leadership development meetings at least twice per year, one of which is
  - during the National PTA Annual Convention and another meeting sometime during the calendar year either in person or electronically.

#### Section 4. Meetings.

- A. Regular. The NCAAC shall meet a minimum of twice per year.
- B. Special. Special meetings may be called by the chair with approval by the National PTA a.—President.


